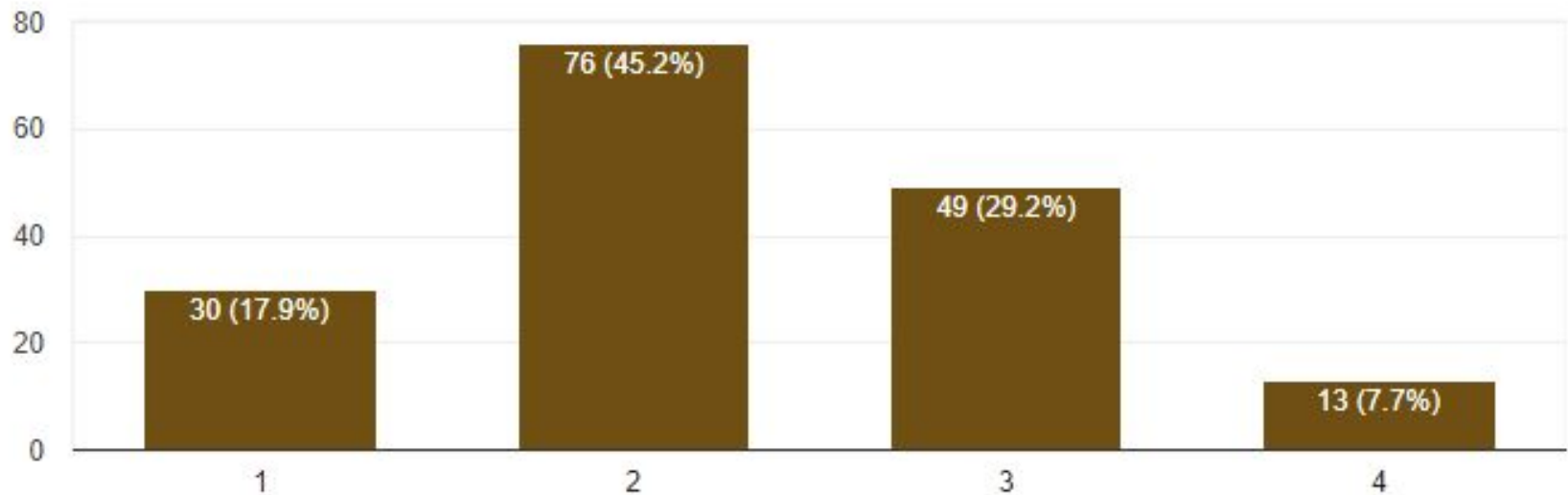

Before you arrived at Shooting Field, how were you feeling about starting Year 9?

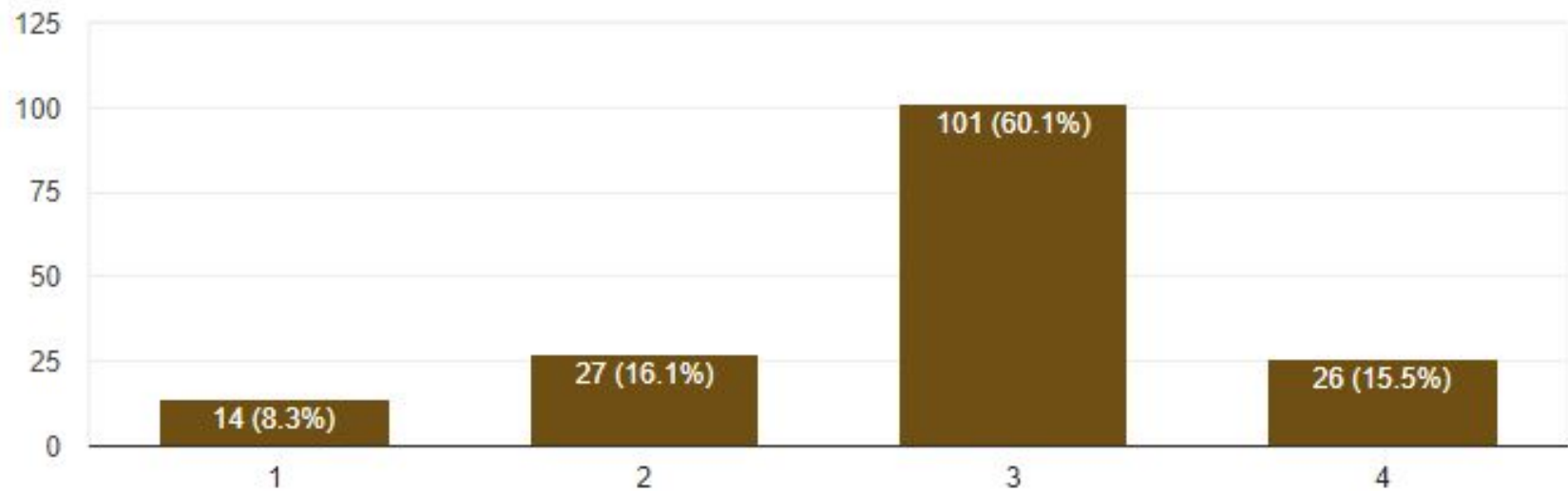
168 responses

Attendance

Attendance

- Every student is expected to have a minimum attendance of 95%, anything below this will be monitored
- You may receive supportive communication in the form of letters, phone calls and/or meetings if attendance persistently falls below 95%
- Although 90% sounds like a high percentage if your child's attendance is below this they are considered a Persistent Absentee (PA) by the Government irrelevant of reason and schools are expected to work with the student/family in order to improve things
- 90% attendance means your child has missed on average 1 day a fortnight, that's 5 hours of lessons!!
- If you have concerns or would like further information on attendance issues contact Mrs Emma Yates, Attendance Development Manager

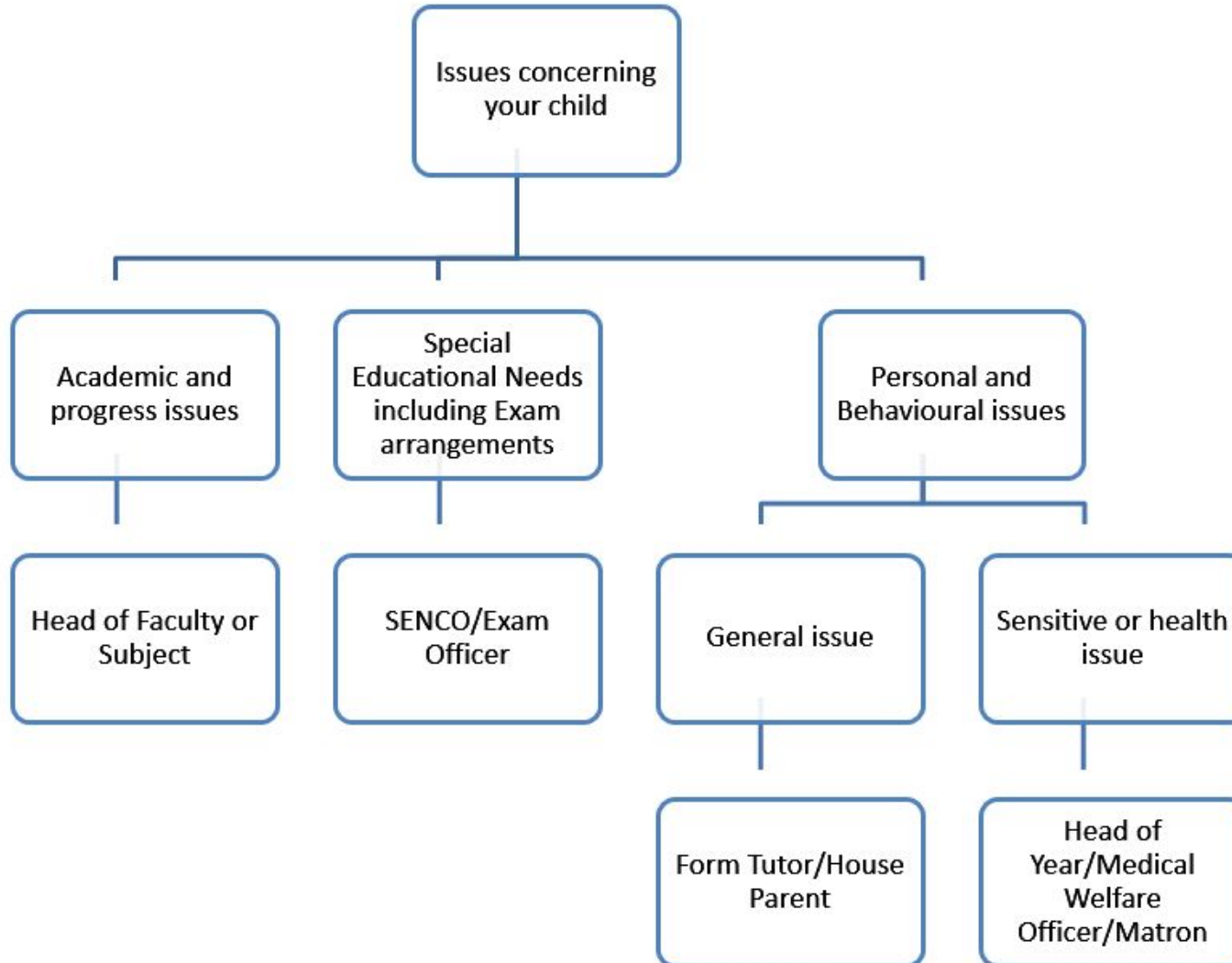


Plan for September
